- Focused professional development on our writing curriculum and alignment with the Smarter Balanced Assessment
- Increased professional development focus on lesson planning, student learning objectives, student engagement and lesson closure
- Alignment of the curricula to national standards
- A strong TAG program including summer science enrichment
- Music enrichment directed by a certified music specialist
- A daily after school program focusing on three skill building items including focused academic intervention, after school and early arrival care and "After School Club" to help working families
- School-wide policies that support the academic and behavioral success of every student including Positive Behavioral Instructional Support (PBIS) and Effective

Behavioral and Instructional Support Systems (EBISS)

- A breakfast, lunch and snack program offered, at no cost, to all students

- An enhanced physical education program that meets the state mandates for daily minutes for grade Kindergarten – 6th grade


