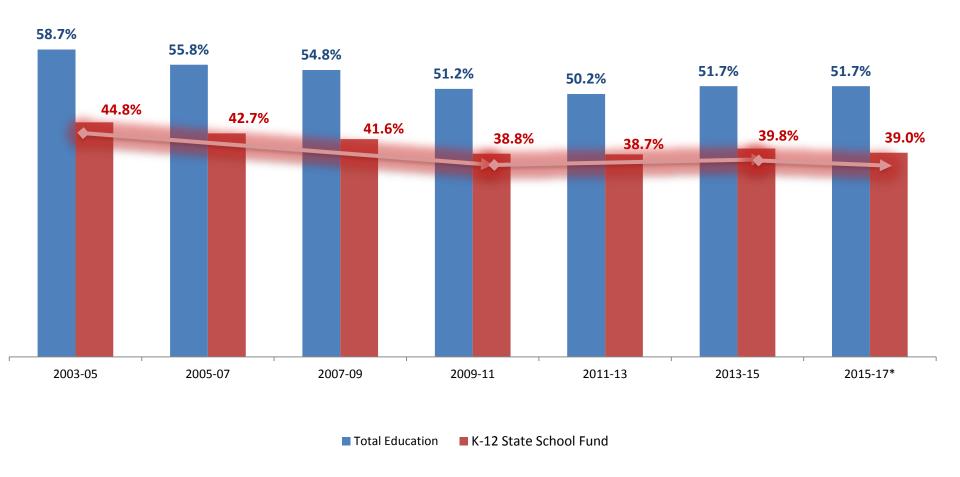

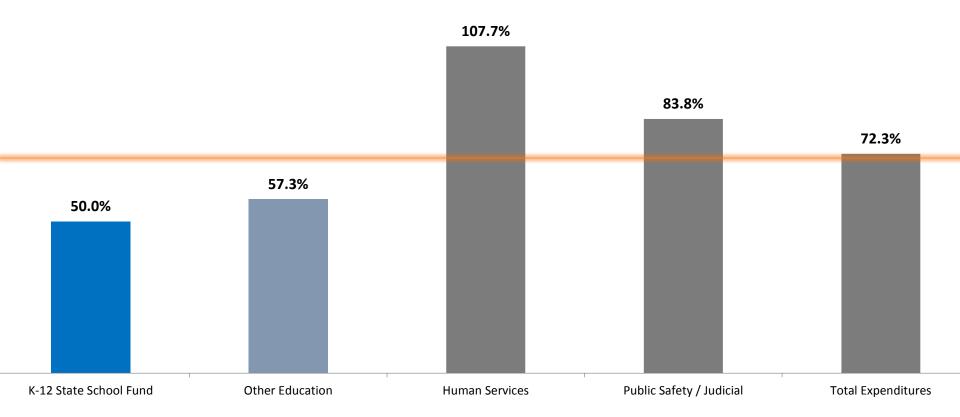

## Education's Share of the State Budget, 2003-05 to 2015-17

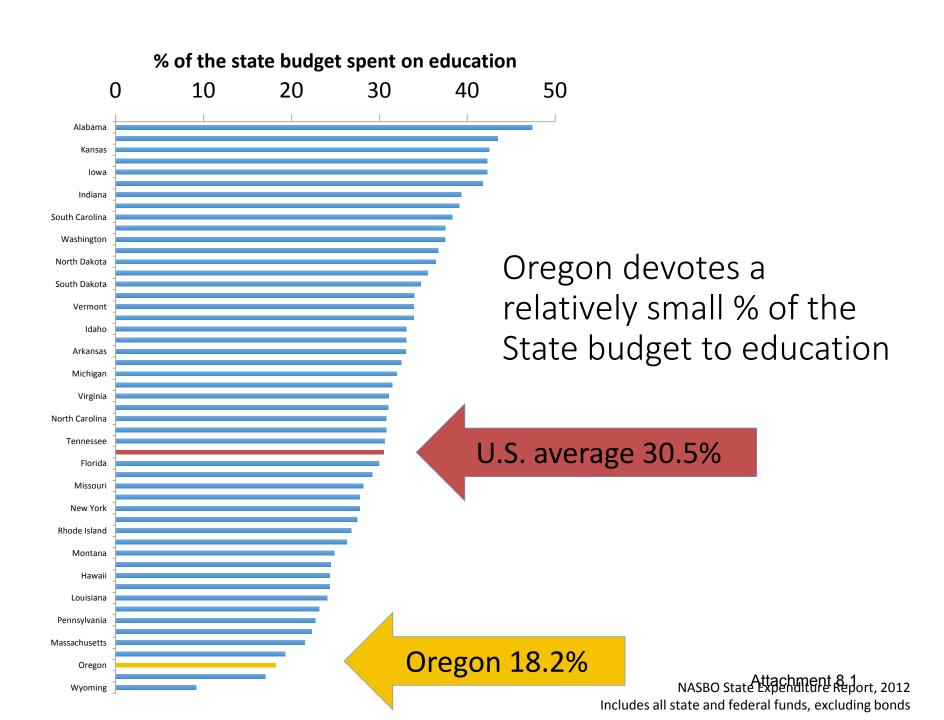

# Percentage of Growth in Oregon State Budget Spending since 2003

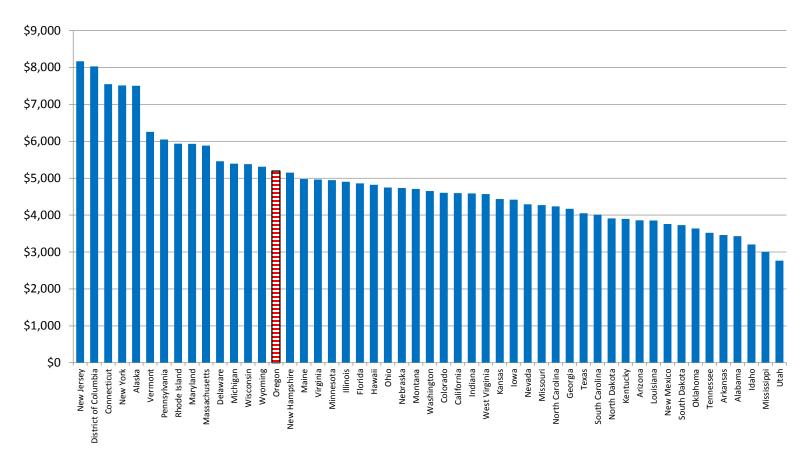

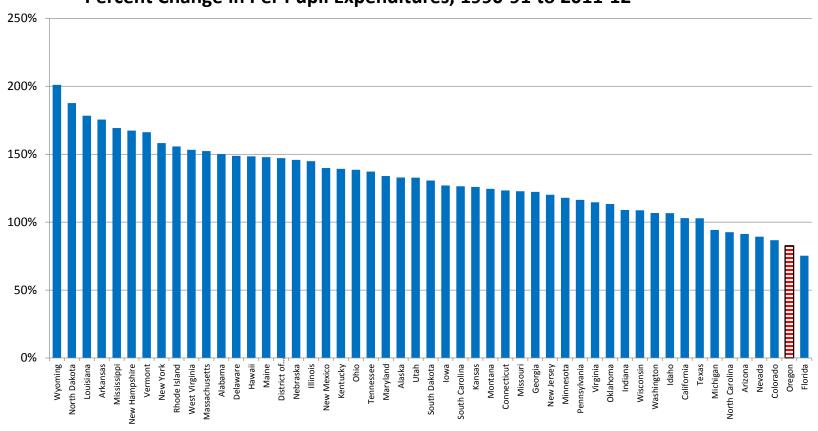
# In 1990-91, Oregon Ranked 15th in Per Pupil Funding





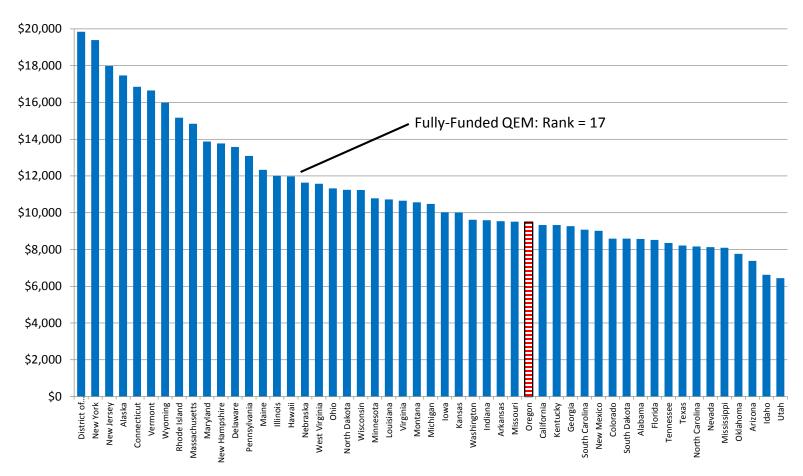
# Oregon Had the Second Lowest Growth in Funding
