- 5.1 Talented and Gifted (TAG) Update and Presentation—Presented by Ms. Green
 - 5% of the Lowell SD population is TAG designated
 - Oregon says we can identify TAG children in reading and math, but sometimes the intellectual abilities in specialty areas can be considered as well
 - TAG addresses an accelerated rate of learning determined by the assessments
- 5.2 Presentation and Demonstration of K-5 Math curriculum being considered for adoption by

Lundy Elementary—Presented by Ms. Edgerton and Ms. Green

- 5.2.1 Demonstration of "paper" and electronic curriculum
 - Previously using Engage New York which was essentially drilling and memorization
 - Piloting a dynamic new program that allows interaction on many levels
 - Some parts require teacher lead instruction, some is student lead, computer based, small group and individual lessons
 - Students can explore the program at home
 - Students can earn 10 second games
 - They have been asking to skip read aloud and asking to go to math
 - This is a new program and is gaining popularity in Oregon: Bethel, McMinnville, Pendleton, Hermiston, La Grande, Junction City, Pleasant Hill, Crow and several others
 - K-5 for this program, another program is being used for middle school and high school is doing college preparatory math
