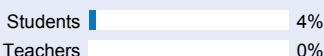

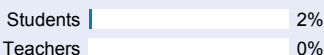

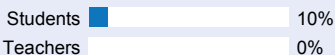

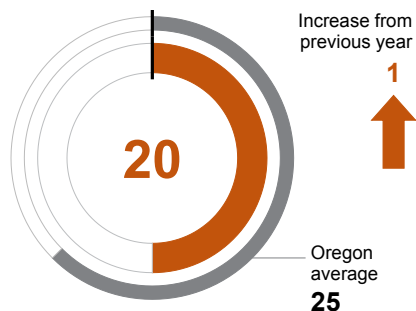

School Environment

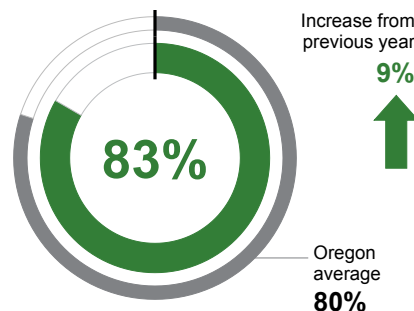
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

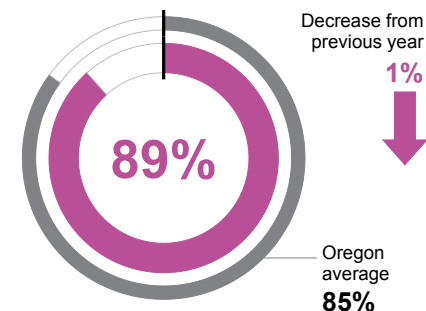
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

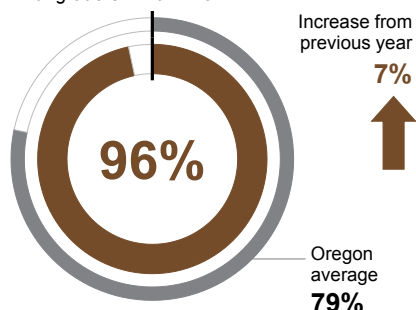
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



Academic Success

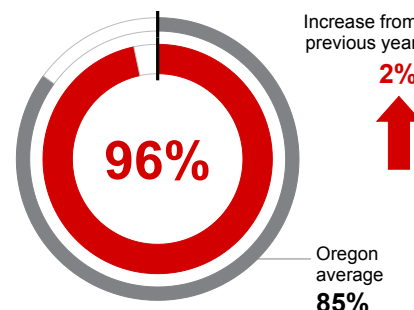
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2014-15.



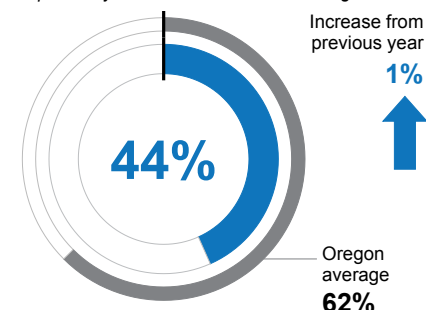
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Lowell Jr./Sr. High School strives to promote student success by providing a rigorous and relevant curriculum and offering tutoring in core academic areas to achieve success. We focus on regular attendance, being on track to graduate at every grade level, and promoting a career and college going culture. Due to our work in this area, our "on track" data and graduation data are at and above the state average. This year our staff is focusing on "writing across the curriculum" and "close reading strategies" to help students become advanced writers and continue to improve literacy skills.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Lowell High School strives to ensure that all students and their parents feel welcome when they enter our school. Frequent communication is sent home through mail, phone, text, social media, and our webpage. Interpreters are provided for parent needing that service. School safety is of the utmost importance to us. Our staff is trained in safety protocols and they work to provide safe and productive learning environments for our students.
