At the same time, we will be making plans and working on the logistics to reopen classrooms for our junior high and high school students. While we are aiming to bring elementary school students back in the coming weeks, we will not be bringing Jr/Sr High students back prior to the second semester. Please note that not every student is best served in our classrooms. Many students and their families have situations or needs that will be best served via distance learning. That option will continue to be available for those that choose this.

Once we have solidified our plans and confirmed the dates in which we will return to classrooms and buildings, we will communicate that with our families and community. We want to make sure we are working hand in hand with our staff to make this transition as seamless as possible.

So here is to beginning a new year in the right direction! We are all counting the minutes until we have giggles and laughter filling our hallways and eager minds filling our classrooms once again!
