Lane County Public Health will be holding a vaccine clinic for people 16 to 17 years old at Lane Community College on April 24 and 25 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. 2,400 doses of Pfizer will be made available for those 16 to 17 years old. Additional doses will be made available to the general public. This clinic is by appointment only, please go to http://lanecounty.org/vaxclinics to schedule your vaccine appointment. Important: All Lane County Public Health clinics are free. You do not need insurance and will not be asked for any financial information. Additional clinics are being held throughout the area, including Lane Events Center (Fairgrounds) and Autzen Stadium.
